Well Done George B. DeLano!

An article in the *Duxbury Reporter* dated Wednesday, August 22, 1990 "PHILIPPE DE LA NOYE'S FAMILY DESCENDS ON TOWN" and here we are again planning our descent to celebrate our ancestor's arrival in Plymouth 400 years ago. The article continues with "150 gather at reunion—they came from as far away as Arizona, Ontario and Michigan."

It was noted that this was the third reunion, but the first to be advertised nationwide, and the first major reunion to be held in Duxbury. "A newsletter is planned and descendant George DeLano, of Virginia, suggested updating by 1999 the family's major genealogical work, written in 1899."



George B. DeLano is a 10th-generation descendant of Philippe de Lanoy (Philip Delano) who arrived at Plymouth Colony on the *Fortune* in 1621. His Delano line of descent is through the Lt. Jonathan branch of the family. Jonathan, the fourth son, married Mercy Warren, granddaughter of Richard Warren of the *Mayflower*.

Captain George Broughton DeLano was born in East Grand Rapid, Michigan, the son of Herman Jenner DeLano and his wife Elizabeth Lenore Broughton. George graduated from Allegan High School and entered the United States Naval Academy where he graduated in 1955. During his 30 years of service, he completed a course in Meteorology at the Naval Postgraduate School in Monterey, California, and has taken various training courses in oceanography, acoustics, mapping, charting and geodesy.

In 1985 George retired from the Navy at Norfolk, Virginia and has devoted his time to the genealogy of the Delano family and became the founding president of the DELANO KINDRED where he served in that office for 20 years. He has served as the editor of the family's newsletter, the *Bonnes Nouvelles* since its inception in 1991.

As President, George has been instrumental in so many of the great strides made by the Kindred. During his long tenure he has been faithfully supported by his lovely wife Diana, their two daughters and his brother Herman DeLano. His dedication, leadership, and quiet authority has been an inspiration and pride of the members of the DELANO KINDRED.

We wish George a happy and relaxing retirement as he now hands over the reins as editor to Nicholas Neagle. Good luck Nick and our deep gratitude for carrying on the *Bonnes Nouvelles* as our new Kindred editor.

ANNUAL MEETING INFORMATION

Time to Celebrate!

It has been 400 years since our ancestor, Philip Delano, arrived in America on the ship Fortune, 30 years since the founding of the Delano Kindred, and 400 years since the Pilgrims held their first Thanksgiving celebration. This is a big year for us, so we've "pulled out all the stops" to mark this special year. This year, the Annual Meeting and Reunion will be held in Plymouth, on the Plimoth Patuxet Museum grounds.

The dates are September 17 – 19, and our "home" hotel will be the Baymont by Wyndham in Kingston, MA, conveniently located between Plymouth and Duxbury. We anticipate a full list of presentations and activities beginning on Friday the 17th for those who can attend in person, and we will conduct the Annual Meeting itself on Saturday the 18th at 1 PM Eastern time both inperson and via Zoom for those who cannot physically be there. **Registration is required** (even for the Zoom meeting). Up-to-Date meeting information is posted on the website (www.delanokindred.us), and a registration form for these events is available there as well. Updates will be posted as they become available.

Reservations for rooms at the Baymont must be made directly with the Baymont PRIOR TO AUGUST 1st to guarantee getting our negotiated rate. Negotiated rates are \$149/night for the 17th and 18th, \$99/night for days either side of those dates (plus tax). You must call the hotel directly at (781) 585-3831 and ask for the Delano Kindred Group rate. Reservations can be cancelled up to the day prior to arrival without penalty and pre-payment is not required.

Getting To the Hotel:

<u>By Air:</u> Although Boston's Logan Airport is closer, landing at the airport in Providence, RI, has often proven to be less costly. The approximate travel time from Boston is 1 hour while the trip from Providence takes 1 hour and 15 minutes.

By Car:

- From Providence and Points Southwest: Take I-95 North, to I-495 South (Exit 12A) to Route 44 East (Exit 15). At the traffic circle, take the 3rd exit and stay on US-44 East. Use the left lane to merge onto MA-3 North toward Boston, then take Exit 18 for MA-3A toward Kingston/North Plymouth. Take a sharp right onto MA-3N/Main Street and turn right on Hilltop Ave. to the hotel.
- From Boston and Points North: Take Route 93 South to Route 3 South. Take exit 7 (MA-3 South toward Cape Cod) onto MA-3 South to Exit 18 and pick up from there in the Providence directions above.
- From Points West: Take the Massachusetts Turnpike East to I-495 South, then pick up from I-495 South in the Providence directions above.

We sadly announce the death of former member **Stephen D. Lyons, Sr.**, 88, of Bloomingdale, New Jersey. Stephen D. Lyons, Sr. passed away on November 14, 2020. Stephen was born in Nyack, NY and grew up in Emerson, NJ. Stephen graduated from Westwood High School in 1950 where he was a varsity football and track and field athlete. He graduated from Rutgers College in 1954 with a B.S. degree in History. While at college, he was a member of ROTC and Alpha Ki Roe. Stephen remained close with several of his fraternity brothers over the years and was particularly proud of his Rutgers education and often attended football games and alumni events. Following college, Stephen served as a U.S. Army First Lieutenant along the Korean Demilitarized Zone. Returning stateside, Stephen was first employed in Labor Relations by Otis Elevators. Stephen and his young family moved to Bloomingdale in 1962, where he was a member of the Board of Education and the Bloomingdale Planning Board for many years. He attended many Butler High School sporting events of his children and continued to attend his grandchildren's sporting events at various high schools and colleges. Besides residing in Bloomingdale, Stephen spent parts of his summers with his children and grandchildren at his ancestral farm in Ossipee, New Hampshire. Son of the late Walter L.
