## Lt. Jonathan Delano Cemetery Marker By Gene DeLano

On a recent visit to Plymouth with some family members in tow, we decided to visit the Acushnet, MA cemetery, where the stones of some of our ancestors can be found. Finding the cemetery was the easy part, but our family stones took a bit of time.

The Acushnet Cemetery as it exists today was incorporated in 1811 and encompasses what was an old colonial burying ground, established in 1711 and then known as "Burial Hill". Acushnet was a part of the northeastern section of the town of Dartmouth and was settled in 1659. Lt. Jonathan was one of the original proprietors of Dartmouth and served as a constable in 1680 and 1681. When I posted a photo of the stone to an online group of early New England gravestone enthusiasts, I was surprised to receive a quick reply from the group moderator that this stone had likely come from The John Stevens Shop of Newport, Rhode Island. This shop was established in 1705 and remarkably is still in business today. When contacted, the current proprietor of the shop identified the iconography and lettering style as that of John Stevens the First, the founder of the shop. The stone is also referenced in the book Mallet & Chisel, Gravestone Carvers of Newport, RI in the 18<sup>th</sup> Century, written by Vincent Luti. The head and foot stones for Lt. Jonathan can be found in the oldest section of the

Acushnet Cemetery, on the right-hand side if one enters through the granite archway. Close by are the stones of Mercy Warren Delano, Jonathan's wife, and that of his son Jabez, along with several others.

#### Delano Day! On the Tennessee Valley Railroad

Departing from Delano, Tennessee at 1:30 PM, returning at 5:00 PM. Enjoy a 50-mile roundtrip through the beautiful lower Hiwassee River gorge. This 4-hour round trip takes you to the top of the famous Hiwassee Loop, where the tracks cross over themselves as they corkscrew up the mountain near Farner, Tennessee. There are only 6 of these loops in North America and this is the only one East of the Mississippi River.

- Snacks and souvenirs are available for purchase on the train, including drinks, chips, candy, t-shirts, caps, and books.
- Trains have enclosed, climate-controlled cars pulled by a diesel locomotive and restrooms on each car.
- Parking is located at **9406 Hwy 411**, **Delano**, **TN 37325** (near the Hiwassee/Ocoee Scenic River State Park ranger office).
- Please arrive 30 minutes before departure time. Delano, Tennessee, is located in the Eastern Time Zone (EDT).

If you'd like to incorporate Chattanooga as part of your trip, we can arrange for a 9:45 AM departure on the 65-minute roundtrip Missionary Ridge Local ride that travels to the East Chattanooga Depot where the Soule Shop is located and you can receive a tour of the Soule restoration shop. The trip starts at the Tennessee Valley Railroad Museum: Robert Murray Soule, Jr., was the founding member and

President of the Tennessee Valley Railroad Museum. Under his tutelage, the Tennessee Valley Railroad Museum became the largest operating railroad museum in the Southeast United States. (The Biltmore House is a Châteauesque-style mansion built for George Washington Vanderbilt II, the youngest son of an American family famous for its wealth, between 1889 and 1895 and is the largest privately owned house in the United States, at 178,926 ft<sup>2</sup> of floor space and 135,280 ft<sup>2</sup> of living area. Still owned by George's descendants, it remains one of the most prominent examples of Gilded Age architecture. George Vanderbilt's guests marveled at the magnificent residence containing 34 bedrooms, 43 bathrooms, and 65 fireplaces covering four acres of floor space. Vanderbilt traveled the world to furnish his home: art by Renoir, Whistler, and Sargent; exquisite 16<sup>th</sup>-century tapestries; and 24,000 books in seven languages. This afternoon you can visit more than 60 rooms carefully preserved by Vanderbilt's descendants, rooms appearing as they did a century ago.)



Lunch will be on your own: enjoy the Stable Café for a full meal, or the Biltmore Creamery, Biltmore Bake Shop, or the Courtyard Market for a quicker option. *If there is sufficient interest, we can arrange for a wine tasting at the Antler Hill Winery.*
